ISCB ASC 2018: the countdown is on!

Here at ISCB ASC 2018 headquarters we are busy putting the final touches on what promises to be a great conference. From August 26 to 30, Melbourne will welcome 600 statisticians from around Australia and the world, for the first ever joint conference of the International Society for Clinical Biostatistics (ISCB) and the Statistical Society of Australia.

The conference provides a wonderful opportunity for Australian statisticians to hear and contribute to the latest global research and practice, creating vital and diverse ongoing professional links with other eminent statisticians. The

program boasts 5 plenary speakers: Susan Murphy, Louise Ryan, Thomas Lumley, Chris Holmes, and Natalie Shlomo; 11 invited sessions with over 30 distinguished speakers; and 250 contributed talks. On the Sunday before the conference, 6 short courses across a range of statistical topics will be offered providing a great opportunity to brush up on new skills. There are also a number of social events throughout the conference which will provide a valuable opportunity to catch up with old friends and make new ones. Over 100 posters will be on display, with 40 of these vying for the Poster Pitch Prize. If you're on social media, you can follow the action using the conference hashtag #ISCBASC.

SSA working with VETASSESS

The Statistical Society of Australia was recently contacted by VETASSESS regarding their occupations and skills assessment program. VETASSESS is a gazetted assessing authority and a trusted partner for the Australian Government in four key service areas: pre-migration skills assessment, testing services, assessment against national standards and international TVET consultancy. VETASSESS is responsible for the pre-migration skills assessments for over 240 general professional occupations classified in ANZSCO published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

VETASSESS has authority for assessing skills against the occupation of *Statisticians*. VETASSESS has approached SSA to seek our assistance in updating the criteria for the occupation of *Statistician* as there had been some recent changes in this field. Aligning the criteria with current industry standards and expectation ensures that industry is provided with job ready and capable skilled migrants at all times. SSA Vice President Adrian Barnett and Chair of the Accreditation Committee Neville Weber worked through the occupation criteria and answered questions about the statistical profession.

Working with VETASSESS on the assessment criteria kick-started a promising relationship with the organisation and SSA is looking forward to assisting VETASSESS in the future – not only with any updates of the general criteria from time to time, but also with the assessment of more complex individual cases.


